Recognizing the 70th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and the celebration of “Human Rights Day”.

Mr. LOWENTHAL submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on _____

RESOLUTION

Recognizing the 70th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and the celebration of “Human Rights Day”.

Whereas the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, adopted by the United Nations 70 years ago on December 10, 1948, represents the first comprehensive agreement among nations as to the specific rights and freedoms of all human beings;

Whereas the Universal Declaration of Human Rights upholds the basic principles of liberty and freedom enshrined within the United States Constitution and Bill of Rights;

Whereas human rights awareness is essential to the realization of fundamental freedoms and contributes to pro-

moting equality, preventing conflict and human rights violations, and enhancing participation in democratic processes;

Whereas the United Nations Human Rights Council and the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights were established to uphold the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and to promote and protect human rights around the world;

Whereas the Department of State has historically declared that a central goal of United States foreign policy is the promotion of respect for human rights, as embodied in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights; and

Whereas December 10 of each year is celebrated around the world as “Human Rights Day”: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That the House of Representatives—

2 (1) recognizes the 70th anniversary of the Uni-
3 versal Declaration of Human Rights and the celebra-
4 tion of “Human Rights Day”;

5 (2) supports the ideals of human rights and re-
6 affirms the Universal Declaration of Human Rights;

7 (3) encourages all nations to continue working
8 towards freedom, peace, and security, which can be
9 achieved only through democracy, respect for human
10 rights, and the rule of law;

11 (4) encourages the people of the United States
12 to observe “Human Rights Day” and continue their
13 commitment to upholding freedom, democracy, and
14 human rights across the globe; and

1 (5) calls on all branches of the Federal Govern-
2 ment to uphold the Universal Declaration of Human
3 Rights at home and abroad.
